# World Water Day 2010 Event

The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), UN-Habitat, the UN Secretary General's Advisory Board on Water and Sanitation (UNSGAB) and the Government of Kenya will jointly host on behalf of UN-Water the World Water Day 2010 event on 22 March 2010 at the UNEP/UN-Habitat headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya. The event aims at raising awareness on water quality worldwide and to prompt actions for improvement.



#### **OBJECTIVES**

- Provide a platform to discuss policy options and initiate actions to improve water quality around the world.
- (ii) Provide a forum to discuss the science related to water quality.
- (iii) Raise public awareness on water quality issues worldwide through the media and by engaging leaders of society.

#### THE UN WATER STATEMENT

The UN-Water statement on water quality will provide a basis for discussing measures to improve water quality. The Statement will be a document drafted collaboratively by UN-Water members, partners, scientists and practitioners. It will outline the background, nature and scope of challenges and propose policy options and actions for improving water quality globally.

The Statement will feed into key global political processes and meetings such as the UN General Assembly event on the World Water Day 2010 in New York (22 March 2010); the Commission on Sustainable Development (CSD) session (May 2010); the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) Conference of Parties 10 (October 2010), and the Stockholm World Water Week (September 2010).

#### **CONTRIBUTING ORGANIZATIONS**

UNEP, UN-Habitat, UNSGAB and the Government of Kenya will jointly organize the World Water Day in 2010 on behalf of UN-Water and in collaboration with other UN agencies, partner organizations, non-governmental organizations, governments, the private sector, and research institutions. The World Water Day 2010 event is funded by the organizing UN agencies and the Government of France, while discussions are ongoing on possible co-funding by other partners.
