Introduction

By publishing the Biodiversity Communication and the 2010 Action Plan, the Commission has put the protection of nature and biodiversity firmly on the political agenda and underlined the urgency of effectively implementing its related policy tools. Two of the most important of these are the Birds and Habitats Directives, which have achieved important conservation successes and often proved to be key drivers for sustainable development. However, implementation is not complete yet and these tools have not always been used to their full potential. Now is therefore the time to putting best practice in the spotlight, thus showing the way for swift, effective and consistent implementation across the EU and releasing the full potential of these tools for biodiversity protection and sustainable development. This is why the EEB, with the support of the European Habitats Forum, is organizing this seminar. It aims to bring together the government and Commission officials, stakeholders and NGOs which are implementing the Nature Directives, for a discussion on best practices.

The case studies presented in the workshop will also feature in an EEB publication on the same topic.
