The Forum works by:

- Networking of information via the EHF Secretariat;
- Joint work on priority activities;
- Exchange of information on potential funding sources;
- Regular exchange of publications and newsletters;
- Meetings of the members every six months;
- European fora, for example, the Habitats Scientific Working Group, the European Commission Biodiversity Expert Group, the Bern Convention Standing Committee and advising on the implementation of the EC Habitats Directive and the establishment of the Natura 2000 network.

Main tasks:

- To coordinate the common interests of the members activities to enhance the effectiveness of their programmes;
- To choose a "portfolio" of activities by discussion between the members of the forum at its regular meetings;
- To identify new activities on which the 14 NGO networks can work jointly, as over 400 protected areas are represented in the forum in more than 30 European countries.
